GIFTS WE RECEIVE

Our giving is so important because it enables all our ministries. These are budgeted to cost £627k in 2024. Each year our costs are increasing. At the moment, our current giving levels and other income suggest we will receive £537k in 2024. We have budgeted in faith and have included a faith line of a further £40k in our giving budget. If we achieve this, our income will be £577k, but this would mean we will still have a deficit of £50k in 2024 – to put it another way we will spend £50k more than we receive.

Over the last few years, it's been so encouraging to see our church family growing and our giving increase. Once again we've also been blessed with some one off gifts and grants. It is as important as ever that we stay on our journey of growing our giving as church, to enable us to do all that we do going forwards.

We are expecting to use some of our savings to fund this deficit, and we do have cash savings (reserves) to help fund this deficit in the short term, BUT wouldn't it be great if together we grew our giving?

If everyone increased their current giving by 5% which is about current inflation, that would make a significant impact. If you're a new joiner, we really encourage you to think about how you can contribute to our church life and ministries, including through your giving. Thank you!




The amount people give on a monthly basis:

- Ministry costs: Church ministries and services
- Our buildings: Rent, heating, lighting and maintenance
- Administration: Additional costs of running and managing the church
